

BOSTON TEA PARTY SHIPSSM & MUSEUM OFFERS 'HOMETOWN PASS' PROGRAM TO ALL MASS. RESIDENTS

Current Massachusetts Residents are Eligible for a FREE Ticket to Museum When Bringing a Guest Who Pays for 1 Full Price Adult Ticket

WHAT:

The Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum, which is located on the Congress St Bridge over the same body of water where Griffin's Wharf once stood at which the Boston Tea Party took place on December 16, 1773, offers a year-round Hometown Pass program where any current Massachusetts resident is eligible for a FREE ticket to the Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum when they bring along someone who buys a full price adult ticket (\$29.95). Children 4 and under are free.

HOW:

It's easy! Massachusetts Residents must sign-up for the program by going to www.hometownpass.com then print out the Hometown Pass and bring it to the Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum. A valid driver's license, government issued ID or voter's registration must be shown at the ticket booth in conjunction with the Hometown Pass. The accompanying adult guest ticket (\$29.95) must be purchased at the Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum ticket booths. Tickets may not be purchased online and may not be purchased using any other discounts or coupons.

VALID: The Hometown Pass Program is valid indefinitely

HOURS & TOURS:

The Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum is open daily (closed on Thanksgiving & Christmas Day)

Winter/Spring Hours: Daily - 10:00 a.m. - 4 p.m. (last tour begins at 4 p.m.)
Summer/Fall Hours: Daily - 10:00 a.m. - 5 p.m. (last tour begins at 5 p.m.)

Tours run every 30 min (winter/spring) and every 15 minutes (summer/fall) and last 1 hr.
